



**MINUTES**  
**THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE ROSE HILL CITY COUNCIL**  
**MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, 2018 - 7:00 P.M.**  
**ROSE HILL CITY HALL/COUNCIL CHAMBERS**

**Call to Order**

The regular meeting of the Rose Hill City Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Steve Huckaby. Councilmembers present, Rachel Wright, Beth Pompa, Bill Baker, and Gary Weaver. Administration and staff present: Kelly Mendoza, Interim City Administrator/City Clerk, Nelson Mosley, Police Chief, Rick Cooper, Parks/Streets Supervisor, and Richard Samaniego, City Attorney. Councilmember Ross Chappell was absent with prior notice.

**Invocation and Flag Salute**

Pastor Ron Long, Rose Hill Baptist Church gave the invocation, followed by the flag salute.

**Citizen Forum**

There were none.

**Approval of minutes**

Councilmember Weaver made motion to approve the 09/04/18 minutes, seconded by Pompa. Motion carried 4-0.

**Approval of claims**

Councilmember Weaver made motion to approve appropriation #18, seconded by Baker. Motion carried 4-0.

**Approval of agenda**

Councilmember Weaver made motion to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Pompa. Motion carried 4-0.

**Approval of Preliminary Drainage Improvement along Rose Hill Road**

Councilmember Pompa made motion to proceed with bids for the Drainage Improvement along Rose Hill Road in an amount not to exceed engineer's estimate of \$81,097.50, seconded by Wright. Motion carried 4-0.

**Approval of Administrator's Employment Agreement**

Councilmember Wright made motion to approve the Administrator's Employment Agreement, seconded by Pompa. Motion carried 4-0.

**Staff Reports**

Chief Mosley reported that Officer Weekley would be in K9 training until October 15<sup>th</sup>, field training with Officer Chance was almost finished, and the open officer position was getting close to being filled.

Parks/Streets Supervisor Cooper updated council on the chip and seal work on 160<sup>th</sup>, the vandalism that had occurred at various locations within the city, and noted Dump Day was coming up on Saturday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Interim Administrator Mendoza reported that a Utility Operator had been hired and would be coming on board in the next couple of weeks.

Councilmembers Pompa and Wright inquired about the status of the Deer Creek lift station.

Councilmember Wright inquired about the street plan priorities.

Councilmember Weaver expressed his appreciation for the Police Department in light of the recent shooting of a Sedgwick County Deputy.
