

Charges the Clerk can Dismiss

- Defects (taillight, headlight, mirrors, etc.), upon proof of repair
- No driver's license in possession, upon proof of valid driver's license at time of citation
- Failure to display handicap tag, upon proof of valid handicap tag at time of citation
- No Proof of Insurance, upon proof of valid insurance on vehicle at the time of citation

Proof must be presented to the Clerk within 10 days of the date the citation was issued.

Traffic Amendments Requiring a Court Appearance

For violations not eligible to be amended pursuant to the City of Rose Hill Minor Traffic Amendment Policy, you must appear on your court date and speak with a prosecutor. The prosecutor will consider your driving record and the circumstances surrounding your traffic offense. Any amendment is within the sole discretion of the prosecutor. If the prosecutor agrees to amend your charge, fine amounts will be assessed as set forth below. Full payment is due at the time of the amendment is requested. Your amendment will not be completed until the entire balance is paid.

Possible Amendments:

- Expired vehicle tag less than 3 months
- No or incorrect vehicle tag displayed

Upon proof the vehicle was registered within 30 days of the date the citation was issued, the charge will be dismissed upon payment of \$50 fine, plus court costs.

- No proof of insurance

If you did not have insurance coverage at the time of your ticket and were not involved in an accident, within 30 days of the date the citation was issued you must provide proof that you have obtained current liability insurance coverage for yourself or your vehicle. If you no longer own a vehicle, you may purchase a non-owner's policy that will cover you as the driver of another's vehicle. If approved, the charge will be amended to a lesser offense with a fine of \$300 plus court costs.

- Driving while suspended

If you did not have a valid driver's license at the time of your citation and were not involved in an accident, you must provide proof of reinstatement within 90 days of the date of the offense. If you provide proof that you are making progress toward

reinstatement, that time restriction may be extended an additional 90 days. If approved, the charge will be amended to a lesser offense with a fine of \$200 plus court costs.
